Fesus paid it all.

As we approach Holy Week it is easy to get lost in the many events recorded for us in the four Gospel accounts. From Palm Sunday to Easter morning, we have the climax of Jesus's salvific ministry. In this one week, so many events are recorded for us that we often do not even realize they are a part of Holy week. In olden days, there would be services each day going through the events of Jesus' crucifixion and death. In modern times, services are condensed to just Sunday, Thursday, Friday, and Sunday. This is not due to a lack of zealousness of pastors, but a recognition of the busy world we live in and the reality that the pews would be extremely sparse, if not completely empty, for many of these daily services. Yet as we streamline and compact services we may be forgetting some of the stories. The anointing of Jesus and others are important stories in the Bible that bring us meaning, but their place in holy week is often forgotten.

PALM SUNDAY

Holy Week begins with Palm Sunday, the triumphant entry, when Jesus rides a borrowed colt on whom no one had ever ridden into Jerusalem. We often think of this as Jesus being hailed as a King, and indeed he was received that way. In ancient times of peace, the king would ride through the city in a humble way like Jesus did. So it was right for the people to lay their cloaks down in front of him as he entered.

MONDAY

On Monday, Jesus went into His house, the temple, and cleaned house driving out the moneychangers and those selling sacrifices in there. He made His house a place of worship and not one of marketing. Here he declared His authority and grabs hold of His divinity making it known He is the master of the house, the temple, and exercising His divinity.

TEUSDAY

Tuesday is a day when Jesus went to the Mt. of Olives. There Jesus lamented for Jerusalem, wishing to take the city under his wings like a mother Hen. Jesus is taking time to refresh, renew, and prepare Himself for His Passion that He knows is coming. Tuesday is also the day that Judas goes and negotiates the betrayal of Jesus with the Sanhedrin. Jesus knew these goings on even as He sought peace and solace on the Mount of Olives and as He lamented for Jerusalem.

WEDNESDAY

The Bible is silent on Jesus' actions on Holy Wednesday. Following the day on the Mt. of Olives, many suggest Jesus went to be with friends. To be with Mary and Lazarus whom He raised in nearby Bethany. Scripture though is silent, so there is no need to know, no need to speculate.

MAUNDY THURSDAY

Maundy Thursday is a day we all think we know well. What happened that day is not recorded for us, but on the night in which He was betrayed, Jesus instituted the Lord's Supper for us. Before this though, He went through the rituals of the Seder. Jesus began this by washing the disciples' feet. In so doing, He embodied servant leadership and humbled Himself before the twelve. Then came the Passover meal. The jaws of everyone at the table must have dropped as Jesus changed the narrative giving all those there His body and blood. This is when Judas left to betray Jesus as he had arranged on Tuesday. Jesus took the disciples to the Garden of Gethsemane. There the disciples fell asleep, unable to watch with Jesus for

one bitter hour. There Jesus became so intent in His prayers that His sweat became like blood. There Jesus showed His humanity as He prayed the High Priestly Prayer, asking the Father if there might be another way, and ending with "Thy will be done." Then Judas comes and betrays Jesus with a kiss. The zealous Peter cuts off the ear of the priest's servant, and Jesus heals the man. Jesus rebukes Peter, telling him to put away his sword. The mockery of Jesus' so called trial begins next.

GOOD FRIDAY

The Sanhedrin gather with Jesus as their prisoner, listening to false and misleading testimony, finding Jesus guilty of blasphemy, guilty of claiming to be God. He was. Yet, without authority to put Jesus to death they handed him over to Pilot to be killed. Not for blasphemy, but for insurrection, an offense that held no truth. Jesus was asked if He said "Render unto Caesar what is Caesar's and unto God what is God's." In His trial, Jesus tells Pilot "My Kingdom is not of this world." Unsure of what to do, they passed between Caiaphas in the Jewish temple court and Pilot in the Roman empirical court. Finally, without any real trial under Jewish or Roman law, Jesus is sentenced to death by crucifixion. Simon is grabbed from the crowd to carry the cross of Jesus, who by this point has been whipped to within an inch of His life. He is hung on the cross where Jesus says seven words, phrases, of love and compassion for those He is suffering for. As His disciples are scattered, and only the young man John is by his side at the cross, along with the women who followed Him and His mother, Mary, With a loud shout of one word and then gives up His Spirit. Jesus gave up his life, for it is finished. A foreigner secured the body of Jesus and laid Him in a borrowed tomb. Soldiers were placed to guard the tomb as the sun began to set and the Sabbath began.

HOLY SATURDAY

Saturday must have been a very somber Sabbath here on earth. The disciples were hiding; the women were mourning. Yet in heaven and in hell, it is a different story. Heaven rejoices because the victory over sin, death, and the devil is finally won. Jesus has descended into hell, not to be tormented, but to declare the victory He has won for us upon the cross through his crucifixion and death. We know this now; this is why we heave the Easter vigil service, to remember Jesus' rest in the tomb and to wait for the sign of the victory now won for us, the celebration on Easter Morning.

EASTER

Technically, it is the next week now as the sunsets on Easter vigil and the sun rises on Easter morning. Holy week is over. The passion of Christ is complete. He is risen! He is risen indeed! Alleluia! A blessed holy week and a happy Easter to everyone at Immanuel.

Holy Week Schedule

It's once again time to journey from the triumphant entry into Jerusalem to the cross of Golgotha to the empty tomb of Easter morning. Reliving the events of Holy Week and Easter help us to contemplate the steps our Savior took to win us eternal salvation. We urge all of you to join us here at Immanuel for our Holy Week services.



We begin on **Palm Sunday**, **April 13**. Pick up your palms as you enter church that morning. Then you're invited to join us in the Narthex for our Palm Sunday processional at the beginning of the service.

On **April 17** at 6:30 pm, we will hold our **Maundy Thursday** service. Come and mark the night Christ instituted the Lord's Supper, which we will celebrate as the disciples did with unleavened bread.



We return the next night, **April 18**, at the same time for our **Good Friday** service, where we'll reflect on Jesus' suffering and death to take away our sins.

We celebrate with joy Christ's victory over death with our Easter services on **April 18**. We will have two Easter celebrations with Holy Communion this year. Our **SONrise Service** at 7:00 am will be a unique experience, as we are planning to hold this service outdoors on our front driveway in the rising sun of Easter morning. 



- 6. Repeat with the other spiral. Fill nests with jellybeans and give to a friend!


